

David Allen in the Moravian Records (1775-1776)

11/9/1775. By David Allin, with his Waggon, 5 Days hauling Provision for the Regulars on their Expedition to Cress Creek @ 15/ per Day, £3:15:0. (p1125)

4/23/1776. A new dwelling-house was raised at Br. Baumgarten's, several Brethren from here assisting. Br. Charles Holder has gone to Allen's Furnace for iron which we need for the new saw-mill. (p1061)

5/10/1776. We heard that two Expresses from Wilmington had brought the news that Lord Cornwallace, with 7000 English soldiers, had run in by Brunswieg, and had landed. The iron ordered from Allen's furnace arrived just in good time. As this evening storms came up from every quarter only the twilight service could be held. (p1063)

6/14/1776. Charles Holder rode to Allen's Furnace to get an iron plate, on which lead can be burned. Yesterday Br. Heckewalder was at Richmond. General Muster was being held, and an Express arrived with word that the English had landed at Charlestown, and therefor the Militia from here shall march to Cross Creek next week. (p1066)
